A specific part of this subject banking law are services as deposit, credit and payments, that are studied through specific banking agreements. Deposit contracts, loan agreement as well as documentary letters of credit, and bank guarantees.</p>

They will compare the solutions of national banking law with solutions of comparative legal systems. First, it is about companies (partnership, limited partnership, limited liability company, joint-stock company), but also about entrepreneurs and other legal forms. Among the more important status issues are the following: foundation-incorporation, general characteristics (business name, headquarters, business activity, liability of the founders for company obligations), status changes (mergers, divisions), linking and cooperation of companies (holding, concern, consortium, joint venture) and termination of business entities (bankruptcy and liquidation). Related issues also include registers of business entities and bookkeeping records and business results.</p>					
Learning outcomes (max. 50 words)	<p>Theoretical and practical knowledge of organizations engaged in business activity. Theoretical knowledge should enable students to continue their education at the next levels, as this education is a part of academic studies. Practical knowledge is focused on performing different jobs for companies or for other forms of organization.</p>
